Our History

Rodeo is a true celebration of our proud Western Canadian way of life. Rodeo was founded on the prairies and in the pastures of our great nation. Its humble beginnings date back to small gatherings and brandings where Cowboys and Cowgirls would gather ever proud and eager to showcase their talents. The Canadian Classic Rodeo Association (CCRA) has a long-steeped history dating back to the 1980s. Started by a group of retired professional Cowboys, the CCRA is a benevolent and charitable association founded to give older rodeo contestants a place to compete and enjoy the sport they all love in a safe and secure environment.

The CCRA is unlike any other rodeo association. Although the competition is fierce, the comradery and commitment of its members to the Association and each other is unmatched. It is truly a family! The Goals of the CCRA

The Canadian Classic Rodeo Association works with local rodeo committees across Alberta and into the Northern United States to produce rodeos. We are committed to promoting entertaining events that are ever mindful of the safety of our contestants, fans, sponsors, and our livestock. Western events take us back to a simpler time. A time of fair play, respect, dedication, and honesty.

Our Members

Our membership ranges from 100 to 250 contestants annually. Our contestants are men and women aged 40 to 80+ years old and compete in a wide range of rodeo events such as Barrel Racing, Tie Down Roping, Team Roping, Men's and Ladies Breakaway Roping, Steer Wrestling, and Ribbon Roping. The events are then further separated into age groups. Many of our committees have commented that "no one has more fun" than the members of the CCRA!

Throughout each rodeo season contestants compete to earn points that allow them a position at the Canadian Classic Rodeo Association Finals held annually in October. Our Finals is a three-four day event with over 100 contestants. The CCRA Finals is a wonderful event that brings our fans, sponsors, committee members, and contestants together to celebrate the season. The Finals feature social events such as a pancake breakfast, social mixer, and an awards banquet.

The Canadian Classic Rodeo Association would not be possible without the hard work and efforts of our Rodeo Committees. The CCRA Board and Members appreciate the generous support of our Rodeo Committees. In supporting the Canadian Classic Rodeo Association, you play a key role in preserving our Western Canadian Heritage and our Western way of life.

The Canadian Classic Rodeo Committee Package

CCRA – Regular Season Rodeo and Membership Rodeo Formats

Most of the **regular season rodeos** in our association are put on by local groups of volunteers. In some cases, the bulk of the rodeo production is completely handled by rodeo committees. In other cases, the Committee and the CCRA office and members share the responsibilities of producing the rodeo. Most of these rodeos are two or three day events.

Our newly introduced **Membership Rodeos** are designed to be one day, two head rodeo done on more of a jackpot style format. These rodeos are designed to enable new potential members and new rodeo committees the opportunity to come and try out the association before becoming a fulltime member.

All the CCRA Rodeo Committees will receive an incentive from the Association. The funds from this incentive are to assist the committee in covering the costs of the stock, ambulance and other costs required to put on the rodeo. Part of the funds from this incentive are collected by our office for the committee as direct charge paid by each contestant (stock charge / event fee) and the balance of the incentive comes from a percentage of the entry fees paid by the members. The amount of this incentive is determined by the format of the rodeo, one day rodeo or multiple day etc. and who is producing the rodeo. (How much work the Committee is doing and how much the Association needs to do.)

The process generally begins by a conversation between the Committee and the CCRA Committee Rep or a Board Member to determine the needs of the Committee. This conversation would touch on possible rodeo dates, stock contractor, number of volunteers available, rodeo officials required, readiness of grounds etc. We have attached a “approximate rodeo budget” to help outline and assist each Committee in making sure all aspects are covered.

From those early discussions we can then present each Committee with a possible scenario as to what is the best way to proceed with the rodeo as well as a Rodeo Approval Package.

Please find attached a “Rodeo Production Outline”, a sample “Rodeo Budget” and a “Committee Questionnaire”. If additional fees are to be required, they can be passed on as required such as stall rentals etc. The Committees are also encouraged to operate beer gardens or cabaret, rent stalls, and arrange any other special events that may accompany the rodeo.

If your committee wishes to proceed with the process, a \$150.00 application fee is required along with the completion of the attached application form. Tentative dates are to be submitted along with the application to be considered.

ADDITIONAL INFO

RODEO PACKAGES:

A rodeo package will be sent from the CCRA office to your committee/secretary approximately one week prior to your rodeo. This package includes information on committee responsibilities, judge/timer sheets, contestant entry fee receipts, etc. When the rodeos are complete, your package must be returned to the CCRA office within four days of the last rodeo with the following:

- * Completed payout & results worksheets for each event.
- * All four copies of judges and timers' sheets, one judge copy attached to the above worksheets.
- * The second copy of the contestant receipts with payment method marked on each (ie: chq/cash/cc)
- * Rodeo committees may either have contestants make their entry fee cheques payable to their committee or ag society (if that is easier and helps them with grants) or to the CCRA, the choice is yours. Any money collected for outside fees (stalls, dinner etc) must be made payable to the committee or Ag society. CCRA will not be collecting any of these fees.

RODEO COMMUNICATION:

When communicating any information about your event please be aware that the CCRA website is the only official source of communication and information should be given to CCRA office to post on the website. Any posting on the CCRA Facebook page or other social media platforms will not be considered official.

AVAILABLE GRANT MONEY

The Alberta Government has grant/funding programs in place enabling those who qualify to receive assistance with expenses incurred in producing amateur rodeo(s). The Canadian Classic Rodeos are eligible for these grants and are well worth pursuing. For information on possible grant/funding programs go to www.alberta.ca.
